- I will send you a text message unless my mobile phone runs out of money.

Unless is similar in meaning to It can be used instead of if not in	
	sentences.
You must change the form of the verb: negative to; and use	
instead of <i>if not</i> .	
Example:	If you weren't online, you would be able to have more real friends.
	Unless you were online, you would be able to have more real friends.
